
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About the Book:

The book titled 'Technology and Rural India' is a compilation of articles written by technologists, academicians, researchers, and practitioners expressing their views and perspectives on technology aspects related to the rural sector. The book is divided into following sections:

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The National Council of Rural Institutes (NCRI), an autonomous organisation under the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD), was established with the objective of promoting rural higher education to foster rural development, by involving and supporting rural institutions and organisations working at the grass-roots level. The NCRI has been functioning as a catalyst organisation for over a decade-and-a-half helping rural institutions, Gandhian organisations, NGOs, universities and agencies of state government in various projects relating to promotion of rural higher education. Its participation in rural higher education through rural institutes has the larger objective of enhancing support mechanisms for rural development. Rural higher education aims at the alleviation of rural poverty by providing life-skills to the target population for improved quality of life. The emphasis is on experiential learning of the rural people as it is sensitive to their indigenous mores and values.

Rural Resource Informatics Centre (RRIC) is a centralised resource centre at NCRI which supports rural institutes with required information services and the knowledge support that is essential both for the development of necessary interventions and need-based programmes. The role of RRIC is crucial in creating knowledge capital that can help the rural institutes become effective development centres.

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
